Ouch!

To prepare the game, cut out the scared faces and point squares. Glue one point square on the back of each face and cover them with clear contact paper (feel free to use a bandaide instead of the word “ouch” on the back of two of the faces). Put flannel or a magnet on the back of each one, or place them on a table, face side up.

To play the game, put the nine faces on the flannelboard or magnetic white board. Divide the class into two teams. Ask a review question from your lesson. The child who stands first and gives the correct answer gets to come and turn over one face. If it is points, he wins this amount of points for his team and can stop, or he may choose to try again. He can continue to do this as long as he turns over points, but if he gets an “ouch,” he loses all of the points from his turn and must sit down. Ask another question, and continue until your review time is finished. Add the points for each team and tell the class which team is the winner.
