

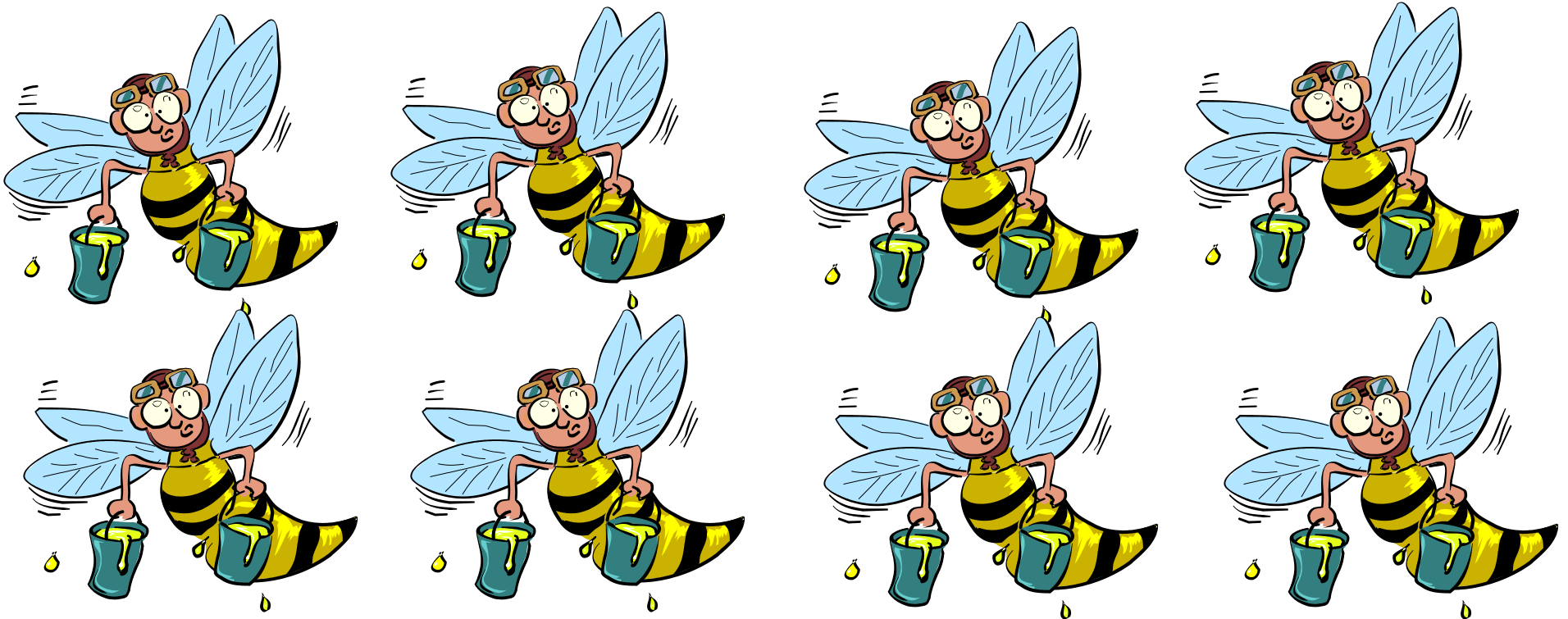
### Race the Bees to Their Hive

To prepare this game, cut out the hives and bees and put clear contact paper on them. Tape each of the hives to a clear zip-lock bag at the front of the room.

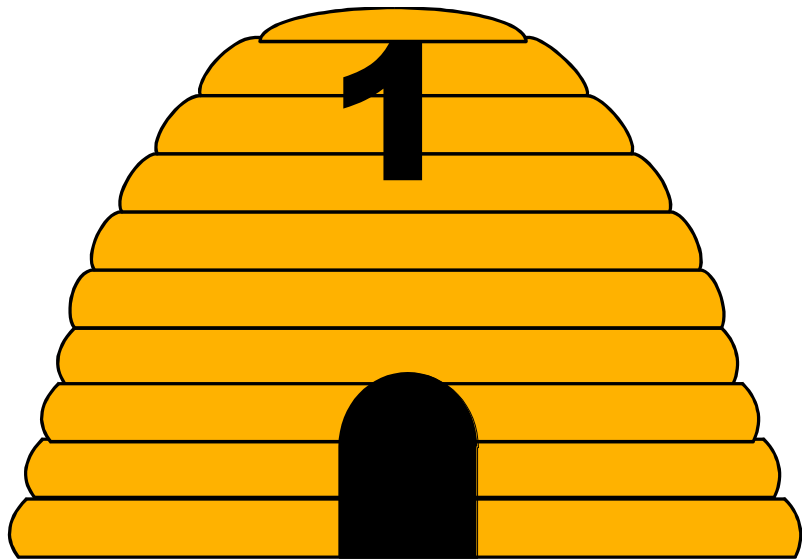
Divide the class into two teams and assign a hive to each team. Explain that the bees have been very busy gathering nectar (put all the bees on a chair on the other side of the room from the hives). The bees are in a hurry to take the nectar home to their hive so they can make honey! See which team can get the most bees home.

Have review questions written from the lesson(s) you have taught. Explain that the first child to stand and give you the correct answer gets to take one of the bees to his team's hive. When all questions have been asked and answered, the team with the most bees in their hive is the winner!

**Variation:** For young children, if you'd like to use this as a motivation for good classroom behavior, make enough bees for each child in your classroom. Give each child a bee when class starts, and explain that each student who is quiet/respectful during the whole class will be invited to put his bee into his team's hive. Then count the bees in each hive to see which team has the most.
